NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

**PROPOSED REISSUANCE
OF
WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS
(National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit)**

The Water Replenishment District of Southern California (hereinafter Discharger or Permittee) is the owner of the Groundwater Reliability Improvement Project – Advanced Water Treatment Facility (GRIP–AWTF) (hereinafter Facility), an Advanced Water Treatment Facility. At the time of permit issuance, the Facility is operated by JF Shea Construction.

The Facility discharges wastewater to the San Gabriel River, a water of the United States. This discharge of waste is a new discharge regulated by the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit No. CA0064645. The Discharger submitted Report of Waste Discharge dated January 10, 2017, and applied for an NPDES permit to discharge up to 14.8 million gallons per day (mgd) of fully advanced treated wastewater from the Facility. The application was deemed complete on March 13, 2017.

The GRIP-AWTF receives wastewater from the combined tertiary treated effluent of the San Jose Creek Water Reclamation Plants (SJCWRP), East and West facilities. The tertiary treated wastewater from the SJCWRP flows through a 66-inch pipeline that is located just east of the GRIP-AWTF site. A diversion structure is built on the 66-inch line to divert the flows to the GRIP-AWTF Equalization Tank. Treatment at the GRIP-AWTF consists of ultrafiltration (UF), reverse osmosis (RO) and ultraviolet advanced oxidation processes (UVAOP). Brine wastes and other AWTF similar waste streams (e.g., ultra-filtration backwash) will be discharged via Los Angeles County Sanitation District’s sewer system, in Beverly Boulevard.

The fully advanced treated water flows into the product water storage tank. During normal operation, some of the fully advanced treated water is pumped to the supplemental recharge wells, which will be covered under a separate order. The fully advanced treated water that is not pumped to the supplemental recharge wells flows by gravity to the diversion structure through the open advanced treated water gate. Any excess flows from the equalization tank go over a weir from the equalization tank to the diversion structure where it is blended with the fully advanced treated water. The blended water will then flow back into the 66-inch pipe to the designated discharge outfalls at the San Gabriel River and will be regulated under this NPDES Order.

On the basis of preliminary staff review and application of lawful standards and regulations, the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Los Angeles Region, tentatively proposes to issue waste discharge requirements, including effluent limitations and special conditions.

Interested persons are invited to attend. At the public hearing, the Regional Water Board will hear testimony, if any, pertinent to the discharge, WDRs, and permit. Oral testimony will be heard; however, for accuracy of the record, important testimony should be in writing.

The entire file will become a part of the administrative record of this proceeding, irrespective of whether individual documents are specifically referenced during the hearing or contained in the agenda packet. The entire file will not be present in the hearing room. In addition to the materials generated for this proceeding, the file includes the administrative records for the applicable Basin Plan amendments. Should any interested persons desire staff to bring to the hearing any particular documents that are not included in the agenda packet, they must submit a written or electronic request to staff during business hours, not later than five business days before the hearing. The request must identify the documents with enough specificity for staff to locate them.

PUBLIC COMMENTS AND SUBMITTAL OF EVIDENCE

Persons wishing to comment on, or object to, the tentative waste discharge requirements, or submit evidence for the Board to consider, are invited to submit them in writing to Raul Medina at the above address, or send them electronically to raul.medina@waterboards.ca.gov. To be evaluated and responded to by Regional Water Board staff, included in the Board's agenda folder, and fully considered by the Board, written comments or testimony regarding the tentative must be received no later than **5:00 p.m. on August 4, 2017**. Failure to comply with these requirements is grounds for the Regional Water Board to refuse to admit the proposed written comment or exhibit into evidence pursuant to section 648.4, title 23 of the California Code of Regulations.

NATURE OF HEARING

This proceeding will be a formal adjudicatory proceeding. For such proceedings, the Regional Water Board follows procedures established by the State Water Resources Control Board. These procedures are set forth in regulations commencing with section 647 of title 23 of the California Code of Regulations, in particular, Article 2, commencing with section 648.

PARTIES TO THE HEARING

The following are the parties to this proceeding:

- Water Replenishment District of Southern California/permittee

Any other persons requesting party status must submit a written or electronic request to staff not later than 20 business days before the hearing. All parties will be notified if other persons are so designated.

HEARING PROCEDURE

The Board meeting, of which this hearing is a part, will start at 9:00 a.m. Interested persons are invited to attend. When the agenda item is called, staff will present the matter under consideration, after which oral statements from parties or interested persons will be heard. For accuracy of the record, all important testimony should be in writing. The Board will include in the administrative record written transcriptions of oral testimony that is actually presented at the hearing. Oral testimony may be limited to five minutes or less for each interested person, depending on the number of interested persons wishing to be heard.

Parties or interested persons with similar concerns or opinions are encouraged to choose one representative to speak and are encouraged to coordinate their presentations with each other. Parties will be advised after the receipt of public comments, but prior to the date of the hearing, of the amount of time each is allocated for presentations. That decision will be based upon the complexity and number of issues under consideration, the extent to which the parties have coordinated, the number of parties and interested persons anticipated, and the time available for the hearing. The parties are invited to contact staff not later than **August 24, 2017** (two weeks prior to the hearing) to discuss how much time they believe is necessary for their presentations, and staff will endeavor to accommodate reasonable requests. At the conclusion of testimony, the Board will deliberate in open or close session, and render a decision.

The Board does not generally require the prior identification of witnesses, the cross examination of witnesses, or other procedures not specified in this notice. Parties or persons with special procedural requests or requests for alternative hearing procedures should contact staff, who will endeavor to accommodate reasonable requests. Objections to any procedure to be used during this hearing must be submitted in writing no later than close of business 15 business days prior to the date of the hearing. (Any objections related to the amount of time allocated for parties' presentations must be submitted within two business days of notice thereof, if that date is less than 15 business days before the hearing.) Absent such objections, any procedure not specified in this hearing notice will be waived pursuant to section 648(d) of title 23 of the California Code of Regulations. Procedural objections will not be entertained at the hearing.

If there should not be a quorum on the scheduled date of this meeting, all cases will be automatically continued to the next scheduled meeting in **October 5, 2017**. A continuance will not extend any time set forth herein.
